QUILTED TABLE RUNNER

WHAT YOU NEED:

112cm Cotton Craft Fabric

>Fabric Colour A - 0.4m

>Fabric Colour B - 0.2m

>Fabric Colour C - 0.2m

>Fabric Colour D - 1.5m

(Sashing/Backing & Binding)

Quilt Batting - 0.6m



CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Colour A – Fussy cut 4 each – 6.5" x 6.5" square

Colour B - Cut 2 each – 3.5" strips wof (width of fabric)

Cut 8 each – 3.5" x 6.5" rectangles

Cut 8 each – 3.5" x 3.5" squares

Colour C – same cutting as Colour B

Colour D – Cut 2 each 2" strips along length of fabric (2" x 60"L). Cut a square 10" x 12.5" – from this you will cut 5 each 2" strips 12.5"L

Backing – Cut 19"W x 60"L – this will be larger than the top

Quilt Batting - Cut 19"W x 60"L



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

All seam allowances are 1/4"

STEP I: Sew together the squares of Colour B and Colour C (8 pieces 3-1/2"x 6-1/2"). Press seam towards darker fabric.

STEP 2: Sew these pieces to each side of Colour A (6-1/2" squares). Press seams towards middle.

STEP 3: Sew together the rectangles of Colour B and Colour C (8 pieces 3-1/2" x 12-1/2"). Press seam towards darker fabric.

STEP 4: Sew 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" pieces to top and bottom to create your finished 12-1/2" x 12-1/2" block.

STEP 5: Sew 12-1/2" strips (sashing) joining all 4 blocks. Sew the 60" long strips to the top and bottom of table runner.









PUTTING YOUR RUNNER TOGETHER:

Lay your backing fabric onto a flat surface, wrong sides up. Spray backing fabric with basting spray and lay batting on top, smoothing out the wrinkles. Spray batting with basting spray and lay runner on top leaving 2" border of batting showing. Backing and batting will be larger then the top. Smooth out wrinkles.

You will need to quilt layers together. You can do as little or as much quilting as you would like. Once you're done quilting, trim excess of backing and batting fabric to match the front.

For the binding, Cut 2.5" strips with remainder of Colour D, joining strips end to end to a length of approx. 180" total. Fold in half lengthwise and press.

Sew binding all around using 1/4" to top of runner, carefully folding corners to create a mitered look; and hand-stitch the binding around to the back of the quilt to encase the raw edge.





Your table runner is now ready to add pizzazz to your holiday table decor and impress your family and friends!
