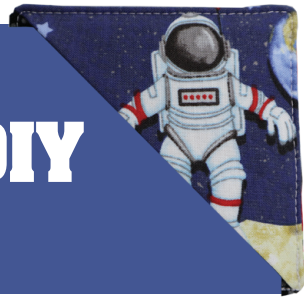


# Fabric Page-Corner Bookmark DIY



## Supplies

*Note: this is enough to make 10 bookmarks*

- .1m each of 3 coordinating cotton fabrics (115cm / 45" wide)  
\*\* or more to allow for "feature" prints as noted below
- .4m of lightweight fusible interfacing (50cm / 20" wide)
- Thread
- Scissor or Rotary Cutter & Mat
- Sewing Machine
- Iron



## Note

You will need 3 cotton squares and 2 interfacing squares to make each bookmark. You should be able to cut 10 squares out of each .1m of fabric, but if you wish to "feature" any particular part of a print you will need to buy extra fabric so that you will be able to cut your squares strategically.

## Instructions

- 1)** Cut 3 cotton squares approximately 10cm (4") each. You can adjust the size up or down if you wish.
- 2)** Cut 2 interfacing squares just slightly smaller than the cotton squares.



- 3)** Press the fusible interfacing squares onto the wrong sides of the front and front flap squares.
- 4)** Fold the front flap piece into a triangle wrong sides together and press.
- 5)** Stack the pieces as follows from bottom up: front side (face up), front flap (preferred side up and aligned with the upper right corner), back side (face down). Pin in place.
- 6)** Using about a 1 cm (3/8") seam allowance, stitch the layers together leaving a 5cm (2") opening for turning along the bottom edge.
- 7)** Trim the four corners and turn right side out.
- 8)** Fold the bottom seam allowance inside and press flat.
- 9)** Edge stitch around all four sides of the bookmark ...and enjoy!
